

On Good Friday, 55 Christians from a number of churches and a handful of denominations prayed a Pro-Life Stations of the Cross while walking behind the Cross around Planned Parenthood, York. It was wonderful to have families join us. It was great, also, to see Knights from #8891 and other York-area councils participate.

In this edition, you will see a flier for a BINGO for Babies at St John the Baptist on Sunday, June 9<sup>th</sup>. Funds raised from this effort will all go to support our Pro-Life activities on S. Beaver Street, York. Get your wives to come out, oh, Knights are welcome, too.

MOVIE TIME: EWTN will feature two outstanding movies in their May lineup.

## **Council Activities - Perspectives from the Chancellor**

So, what is the question(s), I'm sure you are asking. I'll get to that a little later.

As I write this penultimate message, I'm reflecting on the role of a Chancellor and what it has meant to me this year. As I stated at the very first General Meeting, the Chancellor's duty is to strengthen member's interest in council activities. In every message that I wrote and every report that I made at a General Meeting or Business Meeting, my objective was just that...



There is never a doubt about the importance this Council plays in our parish and community. The important work (council activities) that is accomplished, both directly and indirectly, is unmeasurable. All of our important work (council activities) is made possible through your ongoing efforts, dedication, and support as a member of this Council.

Thank you for your on-going and continued support and your unfailing commitment to our Council; the answer is you.

At the April General Meeting, I undertook an exercise to further strengthen member's interest in Council Activities. I first asked, "Who undertook the Lenten Challenge that I put forth?" I saw a whole lot of blank stares! And that was after our Recorder read it as part of the February Minutes; AND it also appeared in the Chancellor's Message in the March Knights Edition. So what was the challenge? Well, it was to attend our own Council Activity – the Novena for Life Prayer and Rosary that took place over nine (9) consecutive Sundays. The challenge – attend just **ONE** Sunday! **ONE** out of nine – that was too much to ask, I guess... My thanks to Rob Galante for taking on the challenge! Of course, there were several members who participated in almost every Sunday – and their voices, raised in prayer, filled the Chapel...

Subsequently, I asked the question, "What is the most important event/program supported by this Council?" I gave some time for everyone to ponder the question; I even mentioned that it is a question that we normally do not consider.

Given some time to ponder, the following list was generated. Once the list was completed, I gave every member two votes in order that they could place emphasis on what they, as one member, felt was most important. Not everyone voted. Some stated that they couldn't select just the two most important; others stated that all of our council activities are equally important; still others just passed.

As the facilitator and recorder, I attempted to capture what I heard. What strikes you about this list? Given all that we do, what is missing? What would you have added/voted for? Would you have added: Family of the Month or Keep Christ in Christmas? As a participant, I would have added the religious education retreats that we undertook under the Domestic Church Initiative and given it both of my two votes. So, how does this list reflect our work efforts as a council; where you are placing your time commitments?

My Observations: Two items are listed as important but received no votes; not even one from the member that listed it. If every one of our activities is equally important, then why didn't this list include each and every one? If given an opportunity to express what is really important, why would anyone just pass? During the past several meetings, we even discussed dropping the New Life Program, yet it was listed and received three votes.

And how great are the seven (7) votes to support our school; however, when it was announced that the April 27th School Dinner-Dance-Auction needed program support from our Council, there was no attempt to organize that support. Can we do better?

Food for Families – 13 votes (nearly 33% of all votes). Yet how many members bring can-goods and food items to every meeting? How many members volunteer to support the food drives? Can we do better? Put June 22nd on your calendar – it is the next food drive date.

Twelve (12) votes addressed pro-life activities. Yet how many members have participated in the 40-days for Life Program or took a day off to travel to D.C. in January?

And what is NOT LISTED -- how about the pro-life program that is undertaken each Wednesday across the street from the Planned Parenthood Center – it is the one and only program that has already and will continue to save lives -- BABIES LIVES! (Note: I specifically requested that Tom Evans not add this program to the list; the intent was to see if another member would).

Have you visited the apartment; ever wonder how all of the bills get payed; or prayed the rosary on the third Sunday of every month? This June, Tom and Pattie Evans will have completed four (4) years there. Can we do better? Put Sunday, June 9th on your calendar – it is Bingo for Babies to support this *important* program.

Now, this was an exercise to get us all thinking more about Council Activities. As the facilitator, I picked up on frustration, disgust, and some feedback that it was a big waste of time. Nonetheless, I also picked up on interest, wonderment, and some feedback that it provided a reflection on who we are and what we accomplish. My hope is that as members left the meeting, they gave some thought to our council activities; my greater hope is that after you have read this message, that you too, will give some thought to our council activities. Lastly my hope is that we all begin to reflect more on our council activities and how best to support them; the answer is you.

By now, I'm sure that you realize from some of my past messages that I travel with John Denver – well his music, at least... In one of his songs, he sings:

'Do you care what is happening around you? Can you understand the need to carry on?'

So, these are two very insightful questions. ARE YOU THE ANSWER?

Some of YOU did respond to those questions when YOU made major contributions of time and effort in support yet another **Council Activity** – the Lenten Dinners. All too often the lack of comprehending the amount of time and effort is taken for granted; all too often those who contributed are overlooked or barely recognized. In this case, it was different! Carefully read the following Lenten Dinner THANK YOU!

John Denver concludes his song with the words:


'A part of everything is here in me.'
