## **Pro Life Report**

Brothers.

This article is blunt, but unfortunately the land that we live in and love is on the verge of a major crisis. Where do we draw the line between right and wrong, and what is humane and barbaric, because some of our politicians are working to draw that line and forge the new laws for us all.



# **INFANTICIDE** - the killing of an infant - PLEASE READ!!!

Question: Who would want to kill infants or even allow themselves to be coerced into cooperating in INFANTICIDE?

- a) The governor and a majority of the legislators in New York State?
- b) The governor (who is a pediatrician) of Virginia?
- c) Vermont's House members?
- d) and possibly the legislators of Rhode Island, New Mexico, California, and Illinois, among others?

**Answer: ALL OF THE ABOVE** - and more states are talking about getting on board the **INFANTICIDE EXPRESS**. **In 1729 Jonathan Swift wrote an essay entitled:** "A MODEST PROPOSAL FOR PREVENTING THE CHILDREN OF POOR PEOPLE FROM BEING A BURDEN ON THEIR PARENTS OR COUNTRY, AND FOR MAKING THEM BENEFICIAL TO THE PUBLIC"

He starts out decrying the horrible conditions the poor in Ireland suffered. Starving mothers fed their children by begging and any other activity that would earn them money. And, in as much as these were mostly Catholic, they were a lot of starving children. In a satirical bit of genius he proffers a solution that is a win for all concerned with the exception of the babies.

Here it is: Let's support these pregnant women and let them produce as many children as they want or as many as his solution would require. He'd see them through pregnancy and help support them for a year after their babies were born. And, then? The babies would be eaten because, "A young healthy child well nursed, is, at a year old, a most delicious nourishing, wholesome food, whether stewed, roasted, baked or boiled, and I make no doubt that it will equally serve in a fricassee or a ragout".

He works out the cost of his program in a way that finds everyone involved is better off in the long run, everyone, that is, but the slain children.

I had a conversation one day with a young lady in our parish who had to read "A Modest Proposal" for one of her college courses. It made her sick. It was just too horrible. I don't want to make you sick, but I ask you to please read it. It's available on line and runs only 4 or 5 pages. If it strikes you the same way it did this young lady, Swift did a good job. He logically takes you from a discussion of the problem, to a solution and then on to how great a benefit this is to society. He wants you to be revolted.

**How close are we now to infanticide?** You decide. "If the mother is in labor...the infant would be delivered. The infant would be kept comfortable. The infant would be resuscitated if that's what the mother and the family desired, and then, a discussion would ensue between the physicians and the mother." (Dr. Ralph Northam, Pediatrician and Governor of Virginia) Discussion? Discus what?

Should we let the baby live or should we kill it? How should we kill it? Starve it to death? Scissors in the back of the neck? How close are we getting to Swift's "modest Proposal"?


## **Council Activities - Perspectives from the Chancellor**

Well, one Council Activity that made many hearts sing was the **Polish Dinner and Dance**. The music, the food, the fun atmosphere, and the joy seen on many faces, truly provided a positive feedback to our message. A lot of time and effort went into all of the preparations which sent a clear message – we welcome you and care about you; we want you to enjoy yourselves; and we are here to feed you – really good food! As a Knight in this Council, how could we not be pleased with our message and blessed by the response – we are all in this together.

For several weeks, this Council promoted an opportunity to consider how BEST to invest in one's future. Did you take a minute to reflect on this one? Did it make you even consider how your future just may play out? The 25 plus parishioners who attended walked away with a REALLY GOOD idea of how they were not only going to prepare but also what they were going to do to invest in their future. This was a parish-wide activity hosted by your Council. Members with insurance programs attended, individual men and women brought their questions and concerns, and one family represented the real reason why the Council presented the workshop. We heard from several insurance specialists and an attorney. EVERYONE left with a wealth of information and a real sense of the need to invest in one's future. So, why didn't you participate? I have other policies, you might claim. Do you believe that you have all of the information you need for your future? Oh, no money to invest or you didn't want to hear a sales pitch – there wasn't ANY of that... Over the past two years, four retreats have been conducted in the parish to begin to build the Domestic Church. This Council has supported each one and I truly believe that the seeds have been planted. On February 16th, nearly 100 people participated in the 5th and 6th grade retreat. The program centered on virtue, included the 5 P.M. Mass and a fabulous dinner hosted by your Council. Feedback was only positive. Are you aware of the Novena for Life? Need I mention, "Faith in Action?" The Novena is JUST one more program under our Faith in Action Initiative. And talk about a MESSAGE! Hey, one more Lenten Challenge (WHY NOT) – and this includes SACRIFICE! Lent is a time to reflect, to pray, and to prepare. This Challenge is to attend ONE, only ONE "That Man Is You" program on Saturday Morning. Join the men's group at 6 A.M. for some breakfast and enjoyable social time. The program starts at 6:30 and concludes by 8 A.M. After ONE, you just might want to attend a SECOND!! As a Knight in this Council, how could we not be pleased with our message and blessed by the response – we are all in this together.

Whether or not you believe we are all in this together, now is the time, according to Father Bob, to celebrate our faith – we are the Church, we are the Council.
