### College Scholarship Information



PVK scholarship - Council 8891 will award one scholarship in the amount of \$1,000.00 to the individual with the highest score. Points are awarded based on grades, in-school and out-of-school

activities, and an essay. The essay is the biggest factor. Applications will be available in the parish office and local schools on December 1. Applicants and their parents must be members of St. John the Baptist parish and be a graduating high school senior or home-schooled equivalent. Students already in college are not eligible. Applicants need not be related to a member of the Knights of Columbus. Applications must be submitted no later than January 31, 2019. The winner will be announced at the Graduating Senior Breakfast in April.

### State Scholarships

One individual in the Diocese of Harrisburg who is a graduating senior or home-school equivalent will be awarded a four-year scholarship totaling \$3,000.00 by the PA State Council. Students already in college are not eligible. Your father or legal guardian must be an active member of the KofC in order to qualify for consideration. No exceptions. The form may be downloaded from the state web site, or you can contact me directly at [rickkorivo@verizon.net](mailto:rickkorivo@verizon.net) or 717-227-2728 to obtain further information. The deadline for submitting applications for this scholarship is December 31, 2018. No exceptions!

### Education Grants

The PA State KofC Education Foundation will be awarding up to 50 grants toward the cost of attendance at Catholic schools for the children of member Knights. The forms can be downloaded from the state web site. The rules for applying are:

1. Grants will be issued for students in grades 1 through 12.
2. The child's father must be a 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree member in good standing for at least 6 months prior to the application. If the father is deceased, he must have been a member in good standing at the time of death.
3. Applications MUST be postmarked no earlier than January 1<sup>st</sup> and no later than March 31<sup>st</sup>.
4. The application should contain all necessary signatures AND the Council seal, which is held by FS Greg Gering. Any application not meeting these rules will be rejected.

Right now, things are going well for the Council but once in a while, I like to remind ourselves that we have a REALLY good thing going here at #8891 and we tend to take much of what we do for granted. We sometimes tend to only look at the problems or issues we have and not look at the whole picture. There are some of us that due to the timing of what pulls us as individuals away from the Council, we don't keep a full picture of what great things we do that we take for granted:

- Tom and Patti Evans just finished their 4<sup>th</sup> year running the 40 Days for Life Campaign out of their apartment across the street from Planned Parenthood in York. This year they had 3 babies saved due to the presence of the participants praying outside of the Center. They had 120 people from 16 different churches participate in the campaign. And we noticed that the Center was closed for most Mondays in which they usually were opened on before.
- Joe Forrester and his wife and daughter ran the Thanksgiving Dinner for the Children's House at Johns Hopkins Hospital for many years but had to give it up due to his move to Mississippi. Kelly Brown stepped up to the plate and along with his wife and Bob Karotko and his wife and Alan Stegmayer, they were able to run the dinner as well as Joe did for years (and even improved a couple of things). When I sent an email to Joe about the status of how Kelly was handling the event, Joe only had one thing to say – “#8891 Rocks!”
- Yes, we donate and help the following Pro-Life groups: The Women's Center of York, Undefeated Courage of Harrisburg, Rachael's Vineyard of Central PA and New Life Center for Women and Children of Glen Rock. And you combine this with Sister Jane Keller (who is our biggest cheerleader!) and the result is that you have a whole lot of women talking about what Council #8891 does! Having such a good reputation with the active women of the area is invaluable!
- Many of you take the “That Man is You” group at St. John's a bit for granted. But did you know that we were the first TMIY group in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and now has grow to more than 40 parishes, which now has more parishes per state only to Texas in which is where it started? Thank you much, Brothers Carl Friedhoff and Rich Sayers!
- Supreme has decided to change the categories and requirements for earning the Columbian award by reducing to 4 categories (from 6). One is the events they recognize under the Life category is to organize a bus to the Washington DC March for Life in January. They have made it harder this year, by requiring the council to organize a bus of at least 50 people to go to the March. Note that the Council has done this for 5 years in a row – and that (by my count being at the March for the last few years) only maybe at the most 5 councils qualify for achieving this goal.

There are other things I could list here, including how many priests really appreciate everything we do for them (Fr. John Paul Mary (Josh Zeller) of EWTN has been asked to join a number of councils but has refused because he is a member of #8891 – which he says it Rocks!). But my purpose in writing this article is to have everyone keep in mind that truly how blessed we are here at #8891, especially now having Fr. Bob Yohe and Fr. Ben Dunkleberger here at St. John's – 2 priests who could not be more supportive of the Knights and especially of #8891. The talent and abilities we have here collectively is beyond compare. We have members of the Council who step up and provide leadership in areas that no one else even thinks of doing (see above). And if you don't believe me, then check with members who have transferred away from the area, like Chuck Carey, Brendan Crimmins, Ken Jones, and others and see what they say.

So, guys – it is OK to say – don't be embarrassed - repeat after me: **#8891 Rocks!**
