Thank you and I look forward to serving you and all my Brother Knights over the next fraternal year.



- **BINGO FOR BABIES** was a huge success. The idea to have a BINGO to support our York outreach (apartment across the street from Planned Parenthood) was spun by our Field Agent, Jon Deakin and Brother Bob Karotko.

They mentioned it to Barry Price and BINGO, we were all off and running. Barry has a plan for everything and in his spare time he repaired our slightly-long-in-tooth BINGO machine. Carol Karotko and Ann Price joined and there was no stopping them. I counted 25 Brother Knights working the event. Wives helped. People with no K of C connection pitched in. It was amazing. 203 people from far and wide played BINGO. When the smoke cleared we netted \$6,000.00. That will keep us going for some time.

Many attendees brought baby gifts. We collected a huge cache of clothes and baby things. Some went to Women's Care Center (York), some to Human Life Services (York) and we have a good supply for a single mom who is due to deliver a baby girl on Sept. 3.

It is not fully outfitted yet, and manning arrangements are still being made, but Becky and Shawn Biter brought the mobile Ultrasound vehicle down from Harrisburg. Some BINGO players took the time to step into it and hear about the plans to utilize this great capability/asset. It will be up and running soon.

NOTA BENE: I have heard from a number of visiting players that they greatly appreciated the warm hospitality of the people of St. John the Baptist. Well done all.

A special shout-out to Brother Rich Sayers, who at the last minute volunteered to be our caller. He did a great job. Being a caller can be dangerous. As it turned out the flak jacket and helmet he brought, were not necessary. This was a kinder and more gentle crowd than you would normally find in a more commercial BINGO. Well done, Rich.


Two more shout outs: Sister Jane came and played BINGO as did Father Dunkelberger. Their presence was noted and appreciated by all.

Excerpts from the memo of Supreme Master Dennis Stoddard, dated 5 June 2019:

Effective midnight, 30 June 2019, the Order will officially retire the 4th Degree Cape and Chapeau uniform. Continued use of that uniform is a direct violation of the Laws and Rules of the 4th Degree. We expect all members of the Color Corps, as Catholic gentlemen, will comply with this policy. As of 1 July 2019 any member of the Color Corps wearing a cape and chapeau to an official event will be denied participation and given a written notice that he is in violation of the policy. If a second violation occurs, the member will be denied participation and be ineligible to serve in the Color Corps for the remainder of the year. Notification of this action will be sent to his Faithful Navigator and the Office of the Supreme Master. Subsequent violations may result in a summary suspension under section 162 (6) of the Laws of the Order.
