
Financial Workshop - Sunday, September 8th - 12pm-3:30 pm

Food for Families effort continues on thanks to the generosity of the council. Our fraternal year started July 1st and totals for both cash donations and pounds of food reset. Our 2018-2019 totals were 3395 total pounds and \$2,981.80 and we have received our \$500 rebate from Supreme and plaque label for our participation in this program for last year.

With recent food donations of 26 pounds, our grand totals for this fraternal year now stand at 49 pounds of food and \$0.00 for the pantry. Thanks to Brother Don Vosnick for the 120 pounds of food to the Lord's lunch. Good job everyone!


