Please do what you can to help out our soup and sandwich sales on 1/11/20 & 1/12/20. Call or email Jim Howell for more info.


Our December Knight of the month was John Nycz and Family of the month was Jim and Patricia Howell.

Pro Life Report

Brothers.

- Father Tom Hoke, most recently pastor of Sacred Heart parish in Spring Grove, died on Saturday, Dec. 14, at the age of 70. Father Hoke was a staunch pro-lifer who did much to support our efforts in York. He had been ill for a long time, but still made his way over to York to boost us. The last time he celebrated Mass in our apartment was Sep. 6. Rest in peace, Father Tom.



- Please join in our Respect Life Rosary in Our Lady's Chapel on Sun, Jan. 19 right after the 9:00 Mass. This will be the Sunday before the National Right to Life March in Washington.
- The National Right to Life March will be on Friday, Jan. 24. Please contact me if you are going to join us. At this writing, we have 17 passengers, 5 are Knights.
- Earlier in Dec., pro-lifers had a virtual shower for a young couple with a 14 mo. old daughter. This couple were expecting their second child and came to Planned Parenthood to terminate that baby. Our sidewalk prayer warriors offered an alternative to abortion and pledged to help them with things they would need. They DID turn away from PP. Our crew in York DID come through for them. On Dec. 12, we were able to deliver everything they needed and then some. On Dec 20 baby Amaris Rose was born, 6 lbs. 13 oz. She's a cutie. Mom and dad know they made the right CHOICE.
- The last Rachel's Vineyard Retreat was Dec. 6-8. All 8 attendees went away changed. They are on paths to heal from the pain of abortion. For more Rachel's Vineyard info call Becky (717 788 4959) The next retreat is Apr. 24-26.
- Our Pennies For Life campaign will be run on 3 Sundays in February.
- Undefeated Courage hosted a successful money-raising GALA on Dec. 14 in Harrisburg. It was a great success. Guest speaker, Matt Birk, formerly of the Ravens, delivered a powerful pro-life message. Try to attend next year.
- And now, some not so good news. Heretofore, Planned Parenthood/York performed abortions almost exclusively on Wednesdays. Two months ago, they began seeing abortion customers on Tuesdays (medical abortions) and Wednesdays (surgical abortions). The past few weeks we estimate that they have done approximately 15 on Tuesdays and 20 on Wednesdays.

Since the last Knights' Edition, Gov. Tom Wolf has expanded on his anti-life stance. He has vowed to veto all Pro-Life legislation the legislature puts on his desk. The next gubernatorial election comes up on Nov 8, 2022.
