Chance Of A Lifetime Raffle (C.O.A.L)

The time of year is here again for our Council to start its **Chance Of A Lifetime (C.O.A.L.)** raffle fundraiser. This very important fundraiser funds the State Council Scholarship Program, in addition to being a very important fundraiser for our Council's charitable projects. Additionally, you have the chance to win 16 great prizes including an assortment of fabulous Trips, Cars, Electronics, Cash, and more. And if you win and don't like the prize, the cash equivalent can be substituted for the prizes. **And yes, the PA State Council moved the date of this fundraiser from the Fall to Spring.**

As in previous years, we are distributing three (3) COAL raffle ticket booklets to each member of Council #8891. Each booklet contains 8 tickets. We are asking you to sell them to family, friends, co-workers, and others, or buy them yourself. It is not mandatory that you purchase and/or sell the tickets, but this is a very easy way for you to support the council, add money to our coffers so we can continue to provide charitable support to the Church, Youth, and Community..... not to mention, you also could potentially one of the great prizes.

The cost of an individual chance is **\$1.00** per ticket. An entire book of 8 chances can be sold/purchased for only **\$6.00 (a \$2.00 savings)**, or a half book (4 chances) can be sold/purchased for **\$3.00 (a \$1.00 savings)**. Or you can purchase the three books for **\$17.00 (a \$7.00 savings)**. When filling out the chances please fill out the small stub and tear off only the larger portion of the ticket (the portion listing the prizes) and give that portion of the ticket to the purchaser. **PLEASE DO NOT SEPARATE or TEAR OFF THE TICKET STUBS FROM THE STAPLED BOOK OF TICKETS AS WE ARE INSTRUCTED TO RETURN THE TICKETS STUBS IN BOOK FORM AS THEY ARE STAPLED TOGETHER.** Remember to fill out your name as the seller of the ticket and list our Council number (8891) on the stub since there are monetary rewards for the sellers of winning tickets. The seller of a winning ticket receives **\$100.00**.

Ticket stubs of all sold books and money from these sales (and any unsold tickets) should be returned in the enclosed envelope. Extra books are also available in our K of C mail slot in the Parish Office, or by contacting. When turning in the sold books, the envelope can be returned:

- 1) at an upcoming General Meeting or Business Meeting,
- 2) in our K of C mailbox in the Parish Office,
- 3) or mailed back to the Council using the parish address on the enclosed addressed envelope.

If you do not plan to sell or purchase the tickets, we request that you please return the COAL raffle ticket booklets in any of the above listed ways so we can provide those booklets to others that need additional tickets to sell.

The raffle drawing will be held on **Thursday, April 30th, 2020**. **The last day to return the sold tickets is Sunday, April 19th** so I have ample time to mail the ticket stubs to COAL headquarters, plus we receive an extra \$0.25 bonus per book for all books received by **April 15th**. And for any additional books we sell over the total number of books we sold in 2018, we will receive an additional \$1.00 per book bonus.

Fr. Cyril Allwein Assembly #944 New 4th Degree Uniform Purchase Reimbursement

In an effort to encourage the purchase of the new uniform for the Knight of Columbus 4th Degree, The Fr. Cyril Allwein Assembly 944 is making available a \$200 reimbursement to its members. This reimbursement is limited to the first 5 members who purchase the new uniform and meet the following criteria:

1. Must be an active member on the Assembly roles.
2. Must purchase the uniform from the official KOC uniform supplier.
3. Must be part of 4 events of the KofC Color Corp, in full uniform, within 12 months of purchasing the uniform.

Those events can be any of the following:

- i. Viewings of a Sir Knight
- ii. Funeral of a Sir Knight or priest
- iii. Any Diocesan event such as ordination of deacons or priests
- iv. Closing of 40 Hours
- v. Events at the parish level such as Blue Mass, First Communion or Confirmation



Procedure:

1. Once the uniform has been purchased from the official supplier, present a proof of purchase to the Faithful Navigator. Proofs can be credit card statement or confirmation of order from the official supplier.
2. When attending an event in uniform, be sure to sign the roster of those attending and keep a record for yourself.
3. Once you have attended 4 events, inform the F.N. of such and provide the events and dates.
4. Once all has been verified a check will be issued.

If you do not meet the requirements of 4 events within 12 months, you will be dropped from the reimbursement program and the next Sir Knight, up to a maximum of 5, will be eligible.
