

- 40 DAYS FOR LIFE WRAP UP - Thanks to all who participated in any way during the campaign. We know that at least 12 Brother Knights prayed on the curb in front of Planned Parenthood/York. 25 St. John parishioners stood peaceful, prayerful vigil. About 120 in all stood vigil.

They came from two dozen different Christian communities stretching from Enola in the north to Manchester, Md. in the south and from Gettysburg in the west to Lancaster in the east.

We know that at least 3 abortion-minded women opted to walk away from Planned Parenthood We are also pretty sure we had one couple seek out the abortion pill reversal protocol after having taken the RU-486 abortion pill.

The 40 Days' managers tell us that at least 850 babies were saved through this campaign. That means that over 20,000 babies have been saved through the 40 Days programs worldwide. Thanks be to God.

- I think it was 5 years ago when Becky Biter, President of Undefeated Courage, got the urge to put a mobile Ultrasound vehicle on the road. Becky has more energy than the Lord. She manages the Rachel's Vineyard Retreats and the Harrisburg Pro-Life efforts in front of Planned Parenthood. The mobile Ultrasound was a huge undertaking. Five years ago, she stopped by St. John the Baptist with a Save-the-Storks van to demonstrate the ability to put an Ultrasound capability anywhere. Our Council presented her with a \$2,000 check to help get the effort started. We, as a Council, have continued to help the effort when we can. I know that they know #8891 "Rocks" and then some.

So why has it taken 5 years? A vehicle had to be purchased. This one came from Denver, Becky drove it here. It needed many repairs. Money was always, and still is, a major consideration. Staffing was not easy. Nurses operating the Ultrasound equipment had to be certified "sonographers" (I think that's what they are called). Intake people had to be trained. Drivers had to be found. Getting the Ultrasound was complicated even though Supreme Council picked up half the cost. Special, temperature and climate-controlled garage facilities had to be located. The Ultrasound equipment does not react well to extreme climatic changes. Then

there were legal issues to consider, certifications, security, equipment installation, etc. etc. etc... The good news is, IT'S HERE. It was on the curb in York, across from Planned Parenthood on Wednesday, Nov 17 and Friday, Nov 19. It will be used here and in York and other venues. I know from York, it was going to be used at a fall fair in the Harrisburg area. I know so many of you have been asking about it. Well, now it's a reality. A *tip of the hat* to Becky Biter and her husband, Deacon Shawn Biter, Vice President of Undefeated Courage, for this Herculean effort.



Box of Joy Project Wrap-Up

The **Box of Joy Project** by Cross Catholic Outreach was a success in its first year here at St. John's. 50 boxes were ordered to be filled by Parishioners as gifts for children in underdeveloped countries. The boxes were for various age groups and either boy or girl. Boxes were quickly distributed after Masses on October 30th and 31st. Filled boxes were to be returned by November 6th at the Church. A total of 57 boxes were filled and donated. Seven more than we gave out thanks to the generosity of parishioners. The boxes were then brought to a Drop Off point to be sent out.

Joshua Bell's 'Stop and Hear the Music' Metro Experiment

In addition to the above Food for Thought article, after hearing Deacon Carl's homily at the 9am mass on November 14th, it struck me so I did some research on Joshua Bell, and also watched the various videos recorded and posted by The Washington Post about their DC Metro experiment, and was both enlightened, but not surprised about the behavior of the public that passed him by in this day and age.

Joshua Bell is one of the world's greatest violinists. His instrument of choice is a \$3.5 million-dollar Stradivarius, which he had at the DC Metro station that day. He played it for spare change that day for about 45 minutes as part of the experiment, incognito, just inside the bustling Metro stop in Washington D.C. to see if anyone would notice?

Unfortunately in this day and age, hardly anyone stopped and noticed. In fact, out of the 1,097 people that passed Bell by in the 45 minutes he played, only 27 gave any money for a total of \$52.17, and only 7 actually stopped and listened for any length of time. I guess my comment on this story is, we all need to stop and slow down and listen to the music more often, because we are missing opportunities and great experiences, and life is short, *i.e.* "*Tempus Fugit*"
