The time of year is here again for our Council to start its **Chance Of A Lifetime (C.O.A.L.)** raffle fundraiser. Similar but a little different to the previous years, we are distributing five (5) COAL raffle tickets to each member and/or friend of Council #8891. We are asking that you sell these tickets to family, friends, co-workers, and others, or buy them yourself. It is not mandatory that you purchase and/or sell the tickets, but this is a very easy way for you to support your council and add money to our coffers so we can continue to provide charitable support to the Church, Youth, and Community..... not to mention, you could also win **\$1,000, \$2,000, \$2,500, \$5,000, \$7,500, \$10,000, or \$15,000**.

The cost of an individual ticket is **\$5.00** per ticket, or you can purchase **4 tickets for \$19.00 (a \$1.00 savings)** or purchase all **5 tickets for \$23.00 (a \$2.00 savings)**. Remember to fill out your name as the seller of the ticket and list our Council number (**8891**) on the stub.

When turning in the sold tickets, the ticket stubs should be returned in the enclosed pre-addressed envelope, or can also be dropped off in our K of C mailbox in the Parish Office; however, due to COVID there may be limited access to the Parish Office so mailing them in the enclosed pre-addressed envelope is recommended. Similar to the dues payments, COAL ticket stubs with payment can also be dropped off in the locked box on the table outside the Parish Office. Checks for both the Dues and COAL tickets can be made out to **“K of C Council #8891”**.

If you do not plan to sell or purchase the tickets, we request that you please return the COAL raffle tickets in the enclosed pre-addressed envelope so we can provide those tickets to other Knights that need additional tickets to sell. Or you can also drop them off in the locked box on the table outside the Parish Office

The raffle drawing will be held on **Friday, April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021**. **The last day to return the sold tickets is Sunday, April 18<sup>th</sup>** so I have ample time to package and mail the ticket stubs and payment to COAL headquarters. **However, any sold ticket stubs returned to COAL headquarters prior to April 1<sup>st</sup> will receive an additional \$0.25 bonus per ticket**, so please try to get your sold ticket stubs to me before March 29<sup>th</sup> so I can send them to COAL HQ with a postmark date prior to April 1<sup>st</sup>.
