

## Pro Life Report



Brothers,

I won't mention our Respect Life Rosary in Our Lady's Chapel but suggest that there is nothing to stop us praying the Rosary often. Our country, our state, our Church, our Bishop and priests and our fellow Americans severely impacted all need as many prayers as we can offer.

### THE BATTLE FOR LIFE GOES ON....

#### PENNSYLVANIA

- In response to the coronavirus, Gov. Wolf called for the shutting down of all non-life sustaining businesses. I had a couple of calls from people who wanted to know if Planned Parenthood, York was going to shut down. Answer? NO.



"The paradox is just striking, here we are making an exception for life-sustaining procedures, and yet, an exception to that is the one medical procedure that's life ending" (Thomas Brejcha, Chief Counsel, Thomas More Law Society)

- So they are open for "abortion only" and they have stepped up business. Whereas a year ago we might have seen 20 or so abortions on abortion day (Wed) we are now seeing about three dozen each week (Tue, Wed, and Fri)

- We have noted that for the last 4 weeks, they provided medical abortions on Fridays without an abortion doctor on the premises. Our assumption was that they were engaged in tele-medicine. Pattie Evans called Maria Gallagher of the Pennsylvania Pro-Life Federation to inquire about this new twist. She was told that Gov. Wolf gave PP permission to obviate the doctor's physical presence.

- Next question. Can we still pray outside PP and offer women another choice?

A PP staffer told us we could not be there. Our Thomas More Law Society tells us that as long as we are following protocols (social distancing, etc.) we can lawfully be there. And so we are still there. On Good Friday, we prayed the Pro Life Stations of the Cross, across the street from PP. We had exactly 10 people participate (per protocols) and we were 8 feet apart at all times. We'll keep at it but I wanted to let you know where we stand vis-a-vis the powers that be. They will protect PP at all times. Stay informed. Remember, elections matter.

#### VIRGINIA

- On Apr 10, Gov. Ralph Northam of Virginia signed into law the Reproductive Health Protection Act. Its title suggests that is really must be a good thing. Not even close.



- Here's what it does.

- It repeals the state law requiring that a woman seeking an abortion see an Ultrasound of her womb, her baby.
- It repeals the 24 hour waiting period prior to the abortion
- It drops the requirement for counseling.
- It permits non-physicians to perform abortions
- It rolls back building safety standards in abortion clinics that are required for other out-patient facilities.

And so, Brothers, here's where we are. Now what? Arthur Ashe's words inspire us, "Start where you are.....Use what you have.....Do what you can."

We know where we are, it's up to each of us to decide what tools we have and what we can do with them.

## The Cooks Corner



### Worthy Brothers,

We have been shut down by the Covid-19 virus. But it has not shut down new plans or thoughts. I am sure many of you are like me, and thinking of things we can do for the rebound. One of the big concerns currently is the increased pressure on the Southern York Food Pantry. If you are in a position to donate food and/or money to this ministry at this time, please do so. Paul Stadler, “Doc”, came -up with the idea of using some of the parish property to create a garden for the food pantry. It of course is something that will need Father’s approval and a sufficient number of Knights who are willing to work in this endeavor. You just can’t plant things and walk away. There is a lot of work, but it is good work. I have been tossing around the idea of having a sandwich event after all Sunday masses, once a month in the summer (June, July, August, September) if we are opened. Proceeds will benefit our Parish or school. The school association generally runs a pit beef fund raiser every summer. We could team-up, we cook – they sell. It would most likely be more profitable for the school association. Well these are thoughts; they need council approval, willing workers, and a semblance of normalcy in the area.

With many Knights at home, I sure hope you guys have stepped up to the plate (no pun intended) to help with the cooking. I know it has given me an opportunity to try some new and different things with what is available at home. My wife does the shopping about once every 2 weeks. Something about my heart condition, lung problem, and suppressed immune system that keeps me home. I want to go out, but the boss won’t let me. I don’t know why? I know how to protect myself and the proper procedures. I have worked in biohazardous labs. None of that seems to make a difference. All I know is that I can’t go out and get things like I was so accustomed to doing. I guess we all yearn for the “good old days.” I did come up with a new and **easy** sauce recipe with tomatoes and roasted peppers. It has no added salt or sugar and it is very tasty. My granddaughter liked it and gave me a 9.6. From her that is a very high score. Here it is anyone can make it. It is different, tasteful, and delicate.

### Easy Tomato & Roasted Pepper Sauce

#### Ingredients:

- 2 14 oz. cans of diced tomatoes with basil, garlic, and oregano (Walmart brand)
- 1 small onion chopped (coarse)
- 4 cloves of garlic chopped (coarse)
- 3 Tbs. of EVOO
- 2 Pepperoncini (stems removed)
- 1 tsp. dry thyme
- ½ tsp. dry rosemary leaves
- 2 Lobes of roasted red bell pepper (about ½ of a pepper) [Botticelli – Sweet Red Peppers, fire roasted]
- 3 Tbs. fresh parsley finely chopped



#### Instructions:

In a two quart pot, heat up the olive oil using medium heat. Add the chopped onions and cook for about four minutes then add the chopped garlic and heat for an additional two minutes. Add the diced tomatoes, thyme, rosemary, pepperoncini, and roasted red pepper. Stir and increase heat until the mixture begins to boil. Reduce heat and cook at a very slow simmer for 30 minutes. Stir the mixture every five minutes. Allow the mixture to cool for about fifteen minutes, then blend in a blender or use an immersion blender to create a homogenous sauce. Finally, add the parsley. Serve over pasta.

Like most sauces, this sauce will be better if refrigerated overnight. Enjoy!

## Chance Of A Lifetime (C.O.A.L.) Raffle April Update

The 2020 COAL raffle was off to a good start, but now due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we have a ways to go to meet and hopefully exceed the prior 2018 campaign where we sold 225 books. For every book sold over the 2018 campaign total we will receive an additional \$1 per book bonus. To date 229 members have received 3 books in the February Knight Edition mailing, and as of this edition 40 members have participated purchasing 172 books. The COAL raffle proceeds benefit both the State Scholarship fund and also our Council #8891, with roughly \$2.75 a book coming back to Council #8891 so we can continue support the many charitable endeavours our council is involved in.

**Now the good news**, COAL Headquarters has moved the COAL drawing date to **July 23<sup>rd</sup>** to allow Councils additional time to sell the COAL books. In the current environment where most K of C Councils have not had the opportunity to run events or make any revenue, COAL Headquarters realized that extending the drawing date by 3 months to July 23<sup>rd</sup> will hopefully allow councils the opportunity to pick up where they left off prior to the COVID-19 pandemic that has restricted most if not all opportunities to sell COAL chances at events and activities.

The cost of an individual chance is \$1.00 per ticket, an entire book of 8 chances can be sold/purchased for only \$6.00 (a \$2.00 savings), or a half book (4 chances) can be sold/purchased for \$3.00 (a \$1.00 savings). Or you can purchase three books for \$17.00 (a \$7.00 savings).

If you need additional COAL books, let me know and I'll mail them to you. Because of the current COVID-19 pandemic and the church being closed, you can turn in sold books by mailing the books to the Council using the addressed envelope included with the COAL books in February Knight Edition, or you can mail them to me at my home address below. Yes the addressed envelope included in the Feb KE goes to our mail box in the Parish Office; however every couple weeks I swing by the church and they give me the mail we have received in our mailbox. If paying by check, make the check payable to "**K of C Council 8891**".


## PRIMARY ELECTION DAY, YORK COUNTY - NOW JUNE 2nd


