

It may not have been the first year Knights from St. Francis of Assisi Council 16839 in Jefferson, N.C., participated in prison ministry, but it may end up being their most important.

The untold story of the Knights



It's not just today's Knights who step into the breach and bring hope to their fellow Catholics. This week, we celebrate the feast day of the Mexican Martyrs – six of them were Knights of Columbus. Here's their story and the story of the Knights' work in Mexico in the 1920s.

On an ordinary day in 1927, as Yocundo Durán walked home in Chihuahua, Mexico, he crossed paths with Federal Gen. Miguel Valle, who was walking out of a local tavern. The general recognized Durán and asked, "Are you a Knight of Columbus?" When he said yes, Durán was shot on the spot. READ MORE
