Chance Of A Lifetime (C.O.A.L.) Raffle April Update

The 2020 COAL raffle is off to a good start, but now due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we have a ways to go to meet and hopefully exceed the prior 2018 campaign where we sold 225 books. For every book sold over the 2018 campaign total we will receive an additional \$1 per book bonus. To date 229 members have received 3 books in the February Knight Edition mailing, and as of this edition 46 members have participated purchasing 193 books. The COAL raffle proceeds benefit both the State Scholarship fund and also our Council #8891, with roughly \$2.75 a book coming back to Council #8891 so we can continue support the many charitable endeavors our council is involved in.

Now the good news, COAL Headquarters has moved the COAL drawing date to **July 23rd** to allow Councils additional time to sell the COAL books. In the current environment where most K of C Councils have not had the opportunity to run events or make any revenue, COAL Headquarters realized that extending the drawing date by 3 months to July 23rd will hopefully allow councils the opportunity to pick up where they left off prior to the COVID-19 pandemic that has restricted most if not all opportunities to sell COAL chances at events and activities. **Since the new drawing date is July 23rd, I will be sending in all the ticket stubs I have received to date on Monday July 13th, so please send me any ticket stubs you have sold but not turned in yet prior to Saturday July 11th.** My address is below.

The cost of an individual chance is \$1.00 per ticket, an entire book of 8 chances can be sold/purchased for only \$6.00 (a \$2.00 savings), or a half book (4 chances) can be sold/purchased for \$3.00 (a \$1.00 savings). Or you can purchase three books for \$17.00 (a \$7.00 savings).

If you need additional COAL books, let me know and I'll mail them to you, and there is also an envelope of books in our K of C mail slot in the Parish Office. If paying by check, make checks payable to “**K of C Council 8891**”.
