Pro Life Report

Brothers,

I know it gets old hearing that we are engaged in a real battle for life or death, but unless you hear what's happening out there, you might not believe we're at war. Consider the following:



In May, two African-American women, Bevelyn Beatty and Ednee Chavennes, were arrested outside the Margaret Sanger Planned Parenthood Center in Manhattan, NYC. These ladies are the co-founders of At The Well Ministries, a group that offers help to abortion-bound women. NYC surely has more than its share of abortion-bound women. MORE BABIES ARE ABORTED IN NEW YORK CITY THAN ARE BORN. They were taken away in handcuffs and booked. They have a court hearing this month. So while New York was burning, being looted and residents were being shot and killed in record numbers why were these ladies arrested? Their crime? They were alleged to have violated Mayor de Blasio's corona-virus, social distancing guidelines. QED

On August 1, Warner DePriest and Erica Caporaletti, two members of Students for Life, were arrested in D.C. for trying to write "Black pre-born lives matter" on the sidewalk in front of Planned Parenthood, using children's chalk. The charge? Defacing property.

Students For Life come every Saturday to this location and offer women alternatives to abortion. Their plan was to paint a message on the street. In as much as others were allowed, without permits, to paint "DEFUND THE POLICE', they wanted equal treatment. They got a permit but the police asked that they use paint that would dissolve over time (tempura?). When they arrived on the 1st, there were six police cars there. They were told they couldn't paint their message on the street. They then took out their chalk and began to write "Black Pre-Born Lives Matter" on the sidewalk. The police warned them that they would be arrested if they persisted. These young people in Students For Life are admirable, courageous advocates for life. They get harassed on college campuses all the time, but they keep at it. They don't surrender, nor should we. They were taken away in handcuffs because someone determined that chalk on the sidewalk was an arrestable offense. They were released at the police station when pro-life lawyers intervened on their behalf.

The battle continues. Keep praying for an end to abortion. Stay informed as to who is on our side and who is not. We have a far too many spineless politicians who talk a good game but get in lock-step with the abortion lobby every time. Find out who they are and vote them out.

40 DAYS FOR LIFE is right around the corner. It runs from Wed, Sep 23 to Sun, Nov 1. We plan to have prayer warriors on the sidewalk, across the street from Planned Parenthood/York every hour they are open. You have already gotten an email from me about the campaign. Please DO consider spending an hour or so a week with us, if you can. If you can't, please pray for the success of the campaign and for the abortion-bound moms going into Planned Parenthood. Hit me with any questions you might have. Pay a visit to the curb before the campaign. We have people up the every Tues., Wed. and Fri. See what we are all about. I promise you that you will meet some great people who feel just as you do on the topic. (717 235 8833)


I will put an article together and get it out you in the near future. The Knights played big part in this success. But, that's not surprising, we Knights ARE Pro-Life.

Warden's Report - 2020 Football Sweepstakes Tickets

Worthy brothers, I hope everyone is well.





Tickets are \$10. Hopefully, the season will not be cancelled. However, in the event the season is cancelled or delayed, the sweepstakes will be held. The State Council plans to hold fantasy football events each week and use previous years' statistics to generate results.

The list below shows our return depending on the number of tickets sold.

\$9 for tickets 1 – 100 \$5 for tickets 101 – 300 \$4 for tickets 301+

As you can see, we make more if we sell more.

The deadline for returns to be eligible for the program is October 13, 2020. Tickets received after this date will be ineligible and will be returned to the council for refund to the purchaser. <u>I need your tickets by October 9</u> to give me enough time to mail them.

Due to the precautions caused by the Corona-19 epidemic, we are limited in how we can sell tickets. The meetings have far fewer members than usual. If you need tickets, please call me or send me an email. I will be happy to run them to your home or meet you at mass when it is convenient for you.

The church office says they have too many worthy groups vying for time outside the church in August and September. The only date I may be able to get is September 20th. I will discuss this at the next business meeting.

Last month I offered the Council this challenge. For the remaining fiscal year July 2020-July 2021 I ask each brother Knight to bring a minimum donation of 5 pounds of food to each meeting that you attend this year. I am proud to say that at the August General meeting you stepped up and met that challenge by donating 44.1 lbs. of food that night. In addition other member donated 27.6 lbs. of food directly to the Pantry that day which give us a total of 77.1 Lbs. Great job, let's keep it coming!

To date Council 8891 has donated 297 lbs. of food and \$1010. Thank you for your very generous efforts!
