We invite you to join Catholics around the world in a novena for the cause of life from Oct. 4 to 12. Throughout these nine days, we will pray for an end to abortion, euthanasia and the many social ills that bring sickness, broken families, unhappiness and premature death. The novena, prepared by the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council, calls upon the intercession of Our Lady and draws from the teachings of Pope Francis regarding the sanctity of all human life.

Each day of the novena, you are invited to reflect on a unique quote from the teachings of Pope Francis on the sanctity of life, pray a decade of the rosary and conclude with a prayer from St. John Paul II's Evangelium Vitae.


How did Father McGivney invite men to the Knights?
