## Chance Of A Lifetime Raffle (C.O.A.L) Update

Brother Knights and friends of Council #8891,

The 2021 COAL raffle has been doing **Great**, Thanks to all the Brother Knights who have purchased or sold tickets. To date we have had 71 Brother Knights (which is 31% of the Council) participate in this year's campaign, 474 tickets have been sold, and we have already exceeded the 2021 budget expectation by \$138.00. **A Big Thank You to the Brother Knights that have supported this campaign.**

We still have a month until the drawing on **April 30<sup>th</sup>** so please try to have any additional COAL tickets sold turned in by **April 21<sup>st</sup>** so I have time to mail the ticket stubs to COAL headquarters.

Just a reminder that the COAL raffle proceeds benefit both the State Scholarship fund and also our Council #8891, with \$2 a ticket going directly to Council #8891 so we can continue to support the many charitable endeavors our council is involved in.

The cost of an individual ticket is **\$5.00** per ticket, or you can purchase **4** tickets for **\$19.00 (a \$1.00 savings)** or purchase the **5** tickets for **\$23.00 (a \$2.00 savings)**. Remember to fill out your name as the seller of the ticket on the Member line and list our Council number (**8891**) on the Council # line.

This year's COAL campaign is different from previous years because you have the chance to win **16 All Cash Prizes** from **\$1,000 to \$15,000**. The previous year Travel prizes would be complicated now with all the COVID restrictions and Automobiles are equally complicated when you have to pay the sales tax when you receive the car, so this year's program has all the prizes as **\$\$\$ Cash \$\$\$**

Ticket stubs from all sold tickets and money from the sale (and any unsold tickets) can be returned in the pre-addressed envelope that was included with the COAL tickets in the January KE or can be dropped off in the Drop Box on the table outside the Parish Office. If you need additional COAL tickets, additional COAL tickets are available in the pouch on the back of the Drop Box on the table outside the Parish Office. Each envelop in the pouch contains 5 tickets. Remember if paying by check, checks should be made out to **"K of C Council #8891"**.

The COAL drawing will be held on **Friday, April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021**. The **last day to return** the sold tickets is **Wednesday, April 21st** so I have ample time to package and mail the ticket stubs and payment to COAL headquarters.
