

Don't Forget to Vote in the Off-Year State Election on May 18th

You may all feel these off-year state elections are a waste of your time since you are only normally voting for the Township Supervisors, a number of Judgeship, and a number of Local positions;



however you are so very wrong, because there are also a couple questions that will **Amend** (e.g. Change) the Constitution of Pennsylvania on the ballot. Plus you will hopefully be voting for the following:

- State-Wide Offices Consider a possible change in Real Estate Taxes
- County-Wide Offices Likewise, consider a possible change in Real Estate Taxes
- Magisterial District Justices
- School Directors Consider a possible change in School Taxes & Academia Leadership

Plus there will be a couple questions on the ballet that will ask for your vote on several key provisions to changes in the PA State Constitution:

Constitutional Article III, Section 9, Amendment #1 – TERMINATION OR EXTENSION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY DECLARATIONS - The wording of this amendment needs to be carefully read.

Constitutional Article IVn Amendment #2 – DISASTER EMERGENCY DECLARATION AND MANAGEMENT. - The wording of this amendment needs to be carefully read.

Constitutional Article 1n Amendment #3 – PROHIBITION AGAINST DENIAL OR ABRIDGMENT OF EQUALITY OF RIGHTS BECAUSE OF RACE OR ETHNICITY - The wording of this amendment needs to be carefully read.

STATEWIDE REFERENDUM – ACT 2020-91 - Making Municipal Fire and Emergency Medical Services Companies Eligible for Loans
