

Brothers,

Now that we are getting back to a more normal way of doing business, I am asking you to consider this.



Will you recollect what you did on behalf of the Pro-Life effort last year or the year before COVID and consider doing that again PLUS one more thing? If you can't recall having done anything, would you try to do something within the next year? There are many ways you can stand up for life: a special visit to the Corpus Christi Chapel, joining in our PRO-Life Rosaries when they resume, attending our Memorial Mass for babies never born in November, joining the National Right to Life March, assisting as an adorer at Rachel's Vineyard retreats, offering up your prayers and fasting on behalf of life, participating in the next 40 Days For Life Campaign, urging our policy makers to govern and legislate respecting the sanctity of life in all its stages, et al.

40 Days For Life - We will have a kick-off rally at John Rudy Park on Sunday, Sep. 19, at 2:00. All Vigilers and their families are invited. The campaign itself will run from Wed., Sep 22 through Sun., Oct. 31. Rachel Stull, Director of The New Life Center for Women and Children, Glen Rock, will be our featured speaker at the kick-off.

We went through the Shrewsbury WAL-MART and loaded up on things like a coffee maker, a small microwave, a broom and dust pan, a frying pan, utensils, etc., etc, etc. There was a short line at checkout and a young man, about 30, in line behind us commented that it looked as if we were setting up another household. Pattie allowed that he was close in his assessment but these things were for a young mom, carrying another baby, who had chosen life. He smiled with a 'good for her' expression. Pattie added that she was tossed out by a guy who wanted that baby aborted. This was shocking to him. We made small talk and said our goodbyes, left the store and loaded the goodies into our car. Pattie was returning the cart to the cart rack when this man caught up to her and holding out his closed hand asked, "Will you give this to that young lady?" Pattie took the rolled up bills, thanked him and assured him the young lady would get them. Not until she got back in the car and counted it, did she realize that he donated \$150 to our young lady. Don't know who he is. Probably will never see him again. Can only say God Bless You. There are so many good people out there. Pattie told the young lady the story of the bills and she cried.
