

## PVK College Scholarship, State Scholarship, & Grant Information

The annual **PVK Scholarship** season has arrived. The council will select one graduating senior or home school equivalent who is a parishioner at St. John the Baptist parish for this year's award. Applications will be available beginning Sunday, December 4<sup>th</sup> and must be received NO LATER THAN Tuesday, January 31<sup>st</sup>. The winner will be announced at a later date.




The **Pennsylvania State Council Scholarship** will award one \$4,000 college scholarship, payable over 4 years, to the son or daughter of a Knight in good standing in the Diocese of Harrisburg. Application forms and rules are on the state website. Deadline for application is December 31, 2022, and includes signatures of council officers, so do not wait until the last minute. Last year's Harrisburg winner was Matt Grohal from our own council.

The **State Council's Education Foundation** will award at least 50 grants of \$1,000 each to students attending Catholic schools in grades 1-12 for the 2023-2024 academic year. Applicants must be the son or daughter of a Knight in good standing who is a member of a Pennsylvania council. You may nominate more than one child, but each application must be in a separate envelope because of the processing and recording requirements. Applications and full rules are on the state website. Important!!! Applications must be postmarked no earlier than Jan. 1, 2023, and no later than Jan. 31, 2023.

# **Preparation is Power**

Preparation is Power whether it is preparing for a new type of event/fund-raiser, or pitching your idea to management, or pitching your event to the community, or pitching your idea to potential investors, a couple important win strategies:



#### **Do Your Homework**

Preparation is everything and preparing for your pitch involves knowing the subject inside and out. To perfect your pitch, keep in mind these tips from Jason Lucash, writing for *Entrepreneur*:



**Keep it short.** Include information that's necessary, but save extraneous details for later questions, ones that will come once you have their interest. This keeps your audience actively engaged.



**Practice really does make perfect.** Know your key points, and practice articulating them. Anticipate the questions you'll be asked and have answers at the ready. With enough practice under your belt, you'll be armed with confidence—and it will show.

**Consider the present—and the future.** During your pitch, you want to show that you have considered financial, operational, and personnel obstacles and possibilities. By doing the necessary homework about your organization's present situation and future needs, your pitch will be sound and thorough.



**Know your audience.** Do they enjoy humor? Do they place a high priority on cutting costs? Do they worry about a particular situation? By presenting your pitch with insight into individual personalities, you'll make valuable connections and gain trust.

You know your pitch is a good one. So, to present yourself—and your idea—in the strongest way possible, be fully prepared. It takes time, but consider that as its own kind of investment; in the end, you'll pitch with the poise and confidence you need to get others on board.

**Take Action:** Think of something small that you want. Now, sell it to yourself standing in front of a mirror. Practice eye contact, smiling, and standing up straight. This will help improve your confidence.
