THE 50th NATIONAL RIGHT TO LIFE MARCH, FRIDAY, JAN 20,2023

This year's March was a great success. We had great crowds, estimated by our side at 100,000, but by the main-stream press groups as "thousands". We expected that.

The weather was wonderful. We had 45 on our bus to D.C. Father Wilke came out (completely vested after the 9:00 Mass) to the bus to pray for and bless us. Our Worthy Grand Knight and Deacon Carl Friedhoff and nine other Brother Knights made the trip along with people from nine different churches and half a dozen wonderfully behaved children.

Full marks to all of the speakers we heard from:

- Lynn Fitch, Attorney General of Mississippi, the lawyer behind the DOBBS case which led to the overturning of ROE v. WADE.

- Coach Tony Dungy and wife, Lauren spoke about the value of all lives and found themselves adopting eight children after they had three of their own. *Note: in less than 24 hours after this the press went after him for mentioning the power of prayer.*
- Dr. Christina Francis, a board certified OB/GYN, and president elect of the American Association of Pro-Life Obstetricians and Gynecologists, spoke of the many women she has seen in the emergency room damaged by abortions.
- Summer Smith, a Liberty University student who is the president of the Students for Life club. She got involved in the pro-life movement after she found out she had a sibling who was aborted. She grieved for her mom for the pain abortion inflicted on her.
- Gina Tomes the founder of a huge maternity home in Nebraska, Bethlehem House.

They all have been most successful in turning lives around.

- A sister and sister combo. Sister Mary Casey belongs to The Sisters for Life. Her twin, Casey Gunning, has Down syndrome. What a great duo they were. Casey said her sister won't disclose her age, "but I will, she's my twin......and I'm forty".
- Dr. Gianna Emanuela Mola, daughter of Saint Gianna Mola. She said, "the gift of life is truly the greatest, the most precious and the most sacred gift we always have to honor, respect and defend".
- Jonathan Roumie, who stars as JESUS in the CHOSEN series made a strong argument for pro-lifers to continue the fight for life.
- Franklin Graham closed the presentation thanking all those, especially politicians, who tirelessly worked to see that was ROE was overturned, this followed by a prayer and blessing.

The theme for this year's March was: **NEXT STEPS: MARCHING FOWARD IN A POST-ROE AMERICA**. So, where do we go from here? From here on out it looks as though the fight will be in each state. Some will enact stronger life protections others will champion abortions at any time, for any reason, and will even look for a legal ways to kill babies after birth. California, New York, Illinois and many other states will keep pushing their anti-life campaigns. Will Pennsylvania and Maryland join these ranks?

Along those lines, I see that my native city, New York, is initiating the distribution of free abortion pills in city clinics in The Bronx, Brooklyn, Queens and Manhattan. Watch for the whole state to adopt this policy. They never stop, nor should we.
