

\*6 baby showers, we are so thankful to all of you for your support for moms and babies in need. You all are so generous.

We try to record the number of clients going in and out of PP, on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays. The total number of clients we recorded in 2022 is 2,522. We know that we missed some clients, but are confident in the accuracy of our numbers. Clients by race: White -1,419, Black -696, Hispanic -221, Asian -56, Question -107, Men -23. March had the most clients with 277. December had the least number of clients with 136. Fridays had the most clients followed by Wednesdays and Tuesdays.

We will continue to persevere in our ministry because we love God's beautiful creations. We all belong to Him and we will do our best to save babies, and the moms and dads from abortion. *God's Will be Done*. We all are in this ministry together.
