Food for Families Report



Our donations to the SYC Food Pantry as of the end of this March 2024 are 3379.53 pounds of food, \$2,770, and 114-man hours. I do not have the end of April Donations yet since the food-drive was held on April 20th, but I can report that the Council donated \$225 to the pantry on April 11th.

April 20 Wal-Mart food drive:

The exact numbers are not in yet; however, it looks like we collected a little over 1,800 pounds of food and \$732 at the Wal-Mart food drive. Great job brothers! I will have the actual numbers at the May General Meeting.

Pro Life Report



Brothers,

PLANNED PARENTHOOD performs 42% of the U.S. abortions. They are the biggest single provider. Herewith are some facts about PP's operation. In 2019, they performed 354,871 abortions in the U.S. That number jumped to 372,105 in 2021, and jumped again in 2023 to 392,715. (*numbers based on PLANNED PARENTHOOD's self-reporting*). There is no reason to believe that the number will start coming down.

FUNDING for PP: PP charges for their services. Customers who don't have sufficient funds to pay get help from the government. Additionally, the government budgets money for PP. That sum has been \$600+ million for the past few years. This year, PP got an \$81million bump to \$699.3 million. Private sector donations are estimated to be around \$1billion. This very large flow of cash into PP allows them to strongly lobby for pro-abortion legislation. Keep praying and fighting for legislation that supports babies being born.

In April, 2023, Colorado enacted a law prohibiting doctors and nurses dispensing abortion-reversal medications. An anonymous tip to authorities informed that Chelsea Nynyk, a nurse-practitioner and certified midwife was operating in violation of the Nurses Practices Act by providing abortion reversal medication. Nynyk challenged that law in BELLA HEALTH AND WELLNESS v. WEISNER, with help from the Becket Fund for Religious Liberty. The challenge was successful.

Administering the abortion reversal medication to a patient within 24 hrs of the patient having taken the first pill (mifeprestone) usually does result in a saved baby. The pro-abortionists will argue that it does not. Read the literature to find out who is telling the truth.

Brothers, let's end this submission on very happy note. A sister and brother at St. John the Baptist School were able to be "Principal for a Day" because their parents submitted the highest bid on the prize at the school's big fun-raiser. What do you think they did with this authority? Well, they asked every student to consider bringing in something for babies (clothes, toys, toiletries, diapers, et al.) that would then go to the two pregnancy outreach centers in York. The response was terrific. The Women's' Care Center and Human Life Services are very grateful to our students and parents for their generosity. I told you this would be a very happy note.

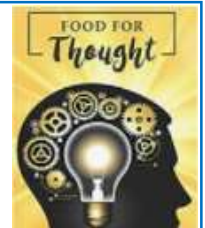
