When we received a letter from Harrisburg KofC on behalf of Morningstar Pregnancy Center, the men of 8891 immediately responded with the full request of \$1,500 to help purchase three new high definition ultrasound machines. When Supreme asked each council worldwide to contribute to the Ukrainian Solidarity Relief Fund, #8891 quickly appropriated the asked \$1,000 donation, plus individual donations. These unbudgeted requests are only possible through your fundraising efforts.

The Southern York County Food Pantry was overflowing with over 1,400 pounds of food and nearly \$1,000 collected at our first Walmart Food Drive in over two years. Coordinating the annual Knights Easter Egg Hunt put countless smiles on the youth of the parish and their parents. The Knights participated in the Community Leaders Annual Partnership Meeting held at SYC School System. Brother Knights coordinated a record breaker Seminarian Raffle. It was a sellout, again. Very nice thank you was received from Special Olympics for our generous donation. The Chance Of A Lifetime fundraiser exceeded expectation. Paul V King Scholarship was successfully coordinated and awarded. Men participated in the Harrisburg Men's Retreat. The monthly Knights Holy Hour Rosary was completed. Another successful Rachel's Vineyard was successfully completed helping to heal hurting souls. Knights and their families helped to decorate Saint John Church with Easter Flowers. Volunteer hours were provided to the church to complete spackling and painting project. For these and more, **Thank You** to all that put their Faith into Action.

Two final items: First, every three years the Grand Knight is required to appoint a Financial Secretary. This position in every KofC Council is essential. Taking the lead in coordination with Supreme, Harrisburg, and within the Council is no easy task. Brothers,

- You are invited to join in our monthly Pro-Life Rosary in Our Lady's Chapel immediately after the 9:00 Mass on May 22.

- The next Rachel's Vineyard Retreat is scheduled in Columbia Pa. for May 27-29. These retreats offer a safe journey to forgiveness which rebuilds the lives of women and men broken by abortion. The weekend retreat intermingles Prayer, Scripture Exercises and Therapeutic group activities that engage the mind body and soul. For more information call 717 788 4959. - On Good Friday, 25 people of various denominations participated in The Stations of the Cross outside Planned Parenthood/York.

- The fight for life goes on Brothers. While some states are trying to restrict abortions others are trying to legislate for more abortions.

California recently enacted legislation that would ensure that no abortion client would have to pay out-ofpocket expenses.

The Maryland House of Delegates passed (93-42) a proposed Amendment to the Maryland Constitution that would enshrine the right to abortion in their Constitution. If the Senate approves it, it will be on the Ballot in Maryland in November.

The Maryland House also approved legislation that would increase the number of abortion providers in the State. The measure would remove a legal restriction that prevents nurse practitioners, nurse midwives and physician assistants from providing abortions. It's no law yet but not because the abortion lobby isn't trying.

California and Maryland are not outliers on this subject. Our governor is on record guaranteeing that he will veto any legislation sent to him that restricts abortion in any way.

Vermont is in the same mix as are Rhode Island, New York, Connecticut and many others. Stay strong and stay informed. These people never let up. Keep praying for an end to this carnage."
