Food for Families Report



As of the end of March 2025, the Council has donated 4,915.7 lbs. of food, \$2,441, a \$50 Walmart gift card, and 196-man hours. In addition, we had a very successful food drive at Walmart on April 5th.

We collected 2,033.5 lbs. of food and \$661, and we donated 57-man hours to the drive. That will bring our YTD total to 6,949.2 pounds of food, \$3,102 in cash, 225-man hours, and a \$50 gift card. Thank you Gentleman, you have proven once again that K of C Council #8891 gets it done!

Thanks for your food donations after the meetings. Keep It Coming! Please remember that it is extremely important that each of you donate at least one food item for each meeting that you attend!

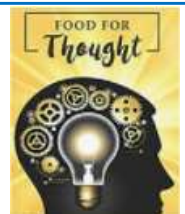
Food for Thought

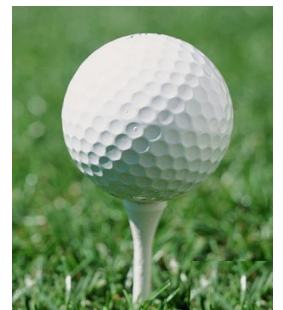
